CELEBRATE the installation of the SureHands Lift! This lift has many benefits and will provide a safer mount for many riders.

The total cost including installation will be \$9,500. To date we have received grants from Wright Hennepin for \$2,000 and The MN Horse Council for \$3,000, Dale Lund donated \$1,000, Buffalo Lions donated \$200 and Freedomfarm volunteer Susan Lasoff fundraised \$590 through her family and friends.

Thank you so much for realizing what a huge benefit this will be. That leaves \$2,710 still needed to fully fund this project.
